Dear Ms. Webb:

The Chicago Mercantile Exchange (“CME” or “Exchange”) hereby requests that the Commission publish the aforementioned proposal in the Federal Register for a 15-day public comment period.

Although the Commission has already posted this proposal on the CFTC web site, the Exchange has learned that market participants are generally unaware of both the proposal and the ability to comment. To allow a full and open exchange of views on this matter, the Exchange believes it needs to be published in the Federal Register, and that interested parties should be given a 15-day comment period to respond. Those individuals who have already commented via the CFTC web site should not be required to submit new comments. Instead, those earlier comments should be combined with, and receive equal consideration as, new comments received in response to the Federal Register notice.

The Exchange understands that this may cause the review process to extend beyond the current January 8, 2004 deadline. Therefore, if the Commission will publish this proposal in the Federal Register, the Exchange will grant the Commission an additional 15 days beyond January 8 to complete its review.
