Chicago Mercantile Exchange Inc. ("CME" or "Exchange") hereby notifies the Commodity Futures Trading Commission ("CFTC" or "Commission") of plans to modify the E-mini Russell 2000 Futures Market Maker Program ("Program"). The modifications to the Program will become effective on July 10, 2017.

Exhibit 1 sets forth the terms of the Program. Modifications appear below, with additions <u>underlined</u> and deletions <del>overstruck</del>.

CME reviewed the designated contract market core principles ("Core Principles") as set forth in the Commodity Exchange Act ("CEA"). During the review, CME staff identified the following Core Principles as potentially being impacted: Prevention of Market Disruption, Execution of Transactions, Protection of Market Participants, Compliance with Rules, and Recordkeeping

The Program will not impact the Exchange's ability to perform its trade practice and market surveillance obligations under the CEA. Exchange staff will monitor trading in the Program's products in order to prevent manipulative trading and market abuse. Additionally, the Exchange has implemented systems to track Program participants' volume to ensure proper distribution of earned incentives. The Program does not impact the Exchange's order execution. Participants in the Program will be selected by CME staff using criteria as set forth in Exhibit 1. Chapter 4 of the Exchange rules includes prohibitions against fraudulent, non-competitive, unfair or abusive practices. All participants must execute a contractual agreement with CME in which each participant will expressly agree to comply with, and be subject to, applicable regulations and Exchange rules. Additionally, the Program is subject to the Exchange's record retention policies, which comply with the CEA.

CME certifies that the Program complies with the CEA and the regulations thereunder. There were no substantive opposing views to this Program.

# **EXHIBIT 1**

# E-mini Russell 2000 Futures Market Maker Program

#### **Program Purpose**

The purpose of this Program is to incentivize participants to support the development of the products listed below. A more liquid contract benefits all participants in the marketplace.

#### **Product Scope**

E-mini Russell 2000 Index Futures ("RTY"), Basis Trade at Index Close ("BTIC") on E-mini Russell 2000 Index Futures ("RLT"), E-mini Russell 2000 Growth Index Futures ("R2G"), BTIC on E-mini Russell 2000 Growth Index Futures ("2GT"), E-mini Russell 2000 Value Index Futures ("R2V"), BTIC on E-mini Russell 2000 Value Index Futures ("2VT") (the "Products").

## **Eligible Participants**

CME may designate up to fifteen (15) participants in the Program. Participants may be CME members or non-members. Potential participants are required to submit an application/bid sheet to the Exchange as part of a competitive application process which is used to determine eligibility. In determining whether a prospective participant is selected to participate in the Program, CME may take into account a variety of factors including the strength of the quoting obligations the prospective participant is willing to commit to provide, the ability of the prospective participant to maintain such obligations, and the prospective participant's historical activity in similar products. Notwithstanding the foregoing, CME may add or subtract from the aforementioned factors as it deems necessary.

### **Program Term**

Start date is July 10, 2017. End date is March 31, 2018.

#### **Hours**

Designated time periods during RTH and ETH.

#### **Obligations**

Participants must quote continuous two-sided markets in the Products at maximum bid/ask spreads and minimum quote sizes.

#### **Incentives**

Upon satisfying all Program obligations, as determined by the Exchange, participants may be eligible to receive predetermined incentives.

### **Monitoring and Termination of Status**

The Exchange shall monitor trading activity and participants' performance and shall retain the right to revoke Program participant status if it concludes from review that a Program participant has failed to meet its obligations or no longer meets the eligibility requirements of the Program.
