Dear Mr. Kirkpatrick:

Chicago Mercantile Exchange Inc. (“CME”) and The Board of Trade of the City of Chicago, Inc. (“CBOT”) (collectively, the “Exchanges”) hereby notify the Commodity Futures Trading Commission (“CFTC” or “Commission”) of plans to implement the U.S. Majors AIR Total Return Futures Market Maker Program (“Program”). The proposed Program will become effective on September 1, 2021.

Exhibit 1 sets forth the terms of this Program.

The Exchanges reviewed the designated contract market core principles (“Core Principles”) as set forth in the Commodity Exchange Act (“CEA”). During the review, the staff identified the following Core Principles as potentially being impacted: Monitoring of Trading, Execution of Transactions, Protection of Market Participants, Compliance with Rules, Availability of General Information, and Recordkeeping.

The Program will not impact the Exchanges’ ability to perform their trade practice and market surveillance obligations under the CEA. The Exchanges’ market regulation staff will monitor trading in the Program’s products in order to prevent manipulative trading and market abuse. The Program does not impact the Exchanges’ order execution. Participants in the Program will be selected by the Exchanges’ staff using criteria as set forth in Exhibit 1. Chapter 4 of the Exchanges’ rules includes prohibitions against fraudulent, non-competitive, unfair, or abusive practices. All participants must execute a contractual agreement with the Exchanges in which each participant will expressly agree to comply with, and be subject to, applicable regulations and the Exchanges’ rules. Additionally, the Program is subject to the Exchanges’ record retention policies, which comply fully with the CEA.

The Exchanges certify that the Program complies with the CEA and the regulations thereunder. There were no substantive opposing views to the Program.

# EXHIBIT 1

## U.S. Majors AIR Total Return Futures Market Maker Program

### Program Purpose

The purpose of the Program is to support the development of the products listed below. A more liquid contract on the central limit order book benefits all participants in the market.

### Product Scope

Adjusted Interest Rate Russell 1000 Total Return Futures ("ARR"), BTIC on Adjusted Interest Rate Russell 1000 Total Return Futures ("ART"), Adjusted Interest Rate Russell 2000 Total Return Futures ("A2R"), BTIC on Adjusted Interest Rate Russell 2000 Total Return Futures ("A2T"), Adjusted Interest Rate Nasdaq-100 Total Return Futures ("AQR"), BTIC on Adjusted Interest Rate Nasdaq-100 Total Return Futures ("AQT"), Adjusted Interest Rate Dow Jones Industrial Average Total Return Index Futures ("ADR"), BTIC on Adjusted Interest Rate Dow Jones Industrial Average Total Return Index Futures ("ADT"), and Adjusted Interest Rate S&P 500 Total Return Futures ("ASR") that are traded on the CME Globex Platform and cleared via CME ClearPort ("Products").

### Eligible Participants

The Exchanges may designate up to seven (7) participants in the Program. Participants must be members of both CME and CBOT. Potential participants are required to submit an application/bid sheet to the Exchanges as part of a competitive application process which is used to determine eligibility. In determining whether or not a prospective participant is selected to participate in the Program, Exchange staff may take into account a variety of factors including the strength of the quoting obligations the prospective participant is willing to commit to provide and historical volume trading the Products and similar contracts. The Exchange may, from time to time, add or subtract from the aforementioned requirements as it deems necessary.

### Program Term

Start date is September 1, 2021. End date is April 30, 2022.

### Hours

8:00AM – 2:45PM CT.

### Obligations

Participants must quote continuous two-sided markets in the Products at maximum bid/ask spreads and minimum quote sizes during a certain percentage of designated hours.

### Incentives

Upon meeting all obligations, as determined by the Exchanges, participants will receive predetermined incentives.

### **Monitoring and Termination of Status**

The Exchanges shall monitor trading activity and participants' performance and shall retain the right to revoke participant status if it concludes from review that a participant has failed to meet its obligations or no longer meets the eligibility requirements of the Program.
