Dear Mr. Kirkpatrick:

New York Mercantile Exchange, Inc. ("NYMEX" or "Exchange") hereby notifies the Commodity Futures Trading Commission ("CFTC" or "Commission") of plans to modify the NYMEX Iron Ore Market Maker Program ("Program"). The modifications to the Program will become effective on October 1, 2016.

Exhibit 1 sets forth the terms of this Program. Modifications appear below, with additions <u>underlined</u> and deletions <del>overstruck</del>.

The Exchange reviewed the designated contract market core principles ("Core Principles") as set forth in the Commodity Exchange Act ("CEA"). During the review, NYMEX staff identified the following Core Principles as potentially being impacted; Prevention of Market Disruption, Execution of Transactions, Protection of Market Participants, Compliance with Rules, and Recordkeeping.

The Program does not impact the Exchange's ability to perform its trade practice and market surveillance obligations under the CEA and NYMEX market regulation staff will monitor trading in the Program's products to prevent manipulative trading and market abuse. Additionally, NYMEX has implemented systems to track Program participants' volume to ensure proper distribution of earned incentives. The products included in this Program are listed for trading in the open and competitive market. Participants in the Program will be selected by Exchange staff using criteria as further stated in Exhibit 1. Chapter 4 of the NYMEX rules includes prohibitions against fraudulent, non-competitive, unfair or abusive practices. All participants must execute a contractual agreement with NYMEX in which each participant will expressly agree to comply with and be subject to, applicable regulations and NYMEX rules. The Program is subject to the Exchange's record retention policies which comply with the CEA.

The Exchange certifies that the Program complies with the CEA and the regulations thereunder. There were no substantive opposing views to this Program.

# **NYMEX Iron Ore Market Maker Program**

# **Program Purpose**

The purpose of the Program is to develop and build liquidity in the Iron Ore products listed below that are <u>is</u> traded on the Globex Platform. The resulting increase in central limit order book liquidity for <u>these</u> <u>this</u> products on the Globex Platform benefits all participant segments in the market.

#### **Product Scope**

Iron Ore 62% Fe, CFR China (TSI) Futures ("TIO") and Iron Ore 62% Fe, CFR China (TSI) Average Price Options ("ICT") that are traded on the Globex Platform (the "Products").

### **Eligible Participants**

There is no limit to the number of participants that may participate in the Program. Participants may be NYMEX members or non-members.

### **Program Term**

Start date is October 1, 2015. End date is September 30, 2016 June 30, 2017.

#### **Obligations**

In order to be eligible to receive Program incentives, Program participants must quote two-sided markets in the applicable Products, at predetermined average bid/ask spreads and minimum quote sizes.

# **Incentives**

Upon satisfying all Program obligations, as determined by the Exchange, Program participants may be eligible to receive predetermined incentives.

#### **Monitoring and Termination of Status**

The Exchange shall monitor participants' activity in the Products and retains the right to revoke Program participant status if it concludes from review that a Program participant no longer meets the eligibility requirements obligations of the Program.
