New York Mercantile Exchange, Inc. ("NYMEX" or "Exchange") hereby notifies the Commodity Futures Trading Commission ("CFTC" or "Commission") of plans to implement the NYMEX WTI Houston Crude Oil Futures Liquidity Provider Program ("Program"). The proposed Program will become effective on November 12, 2018.

Exhibit 1 sets forth the terms of this Program.

NYMEX reviewed the designated contract market core principles ("Core Principles") as set forth in the Commodity Exchange Act ("CEA"). During the review, NYMEX staff identified the following Core Principles as potentially being impacted: Monitoring of Trading, Execution of Transactions, Protection of Market Participants, Compliance with Rules, and Recordkeeping.

The Program will not impact the Exchange's ability to perform its trade practice and market surveillance obligations under the CEA. The Exchange's market regulation staff will monitor trading in the Program's products to prevent manipulative trading and market abuse. Additionally, the Exchange has implemented systems to track Program participants' volume to ensure proper distribution of earned incentives. The incentives in the Program do not impact the Exchange's order execution. Participants in the Program will be selected by NYMEX staff using criteria as further stated in Exhibit 1. Chapter 4 of the NYMEX rules includes prohibitions against fraudulent, non-competitive, unfair or abusive practices. All participants must execute a contractual agreement with NYMEX in which each participant will expressly agree to comply with and be subject to, applicable regulations and NYMEX rules. The Program is subject to the Exchange's record retention policies which comply with the CEA.

NYMEX certifies that the Program complies with the CEA and the regulations thereunder. There were no substantive opposing views to this Program.

EXHIBIT 1

NYMEX WTI Houston Crude Oil Futures Liquidity Provider Program

Program Purpose

The purpose of this Program is to encourage participants to support development and increase liquidity in the products listed below. A more liquid contract benefits all participants in the marketplace.

Product Scope

Brent Last Day Financial Futures ("BZ"), Crude Oil Futures ("CL"), and WTI Houston Crude Oil Futures ("HCL") that are traded on the CME Globex Platform or cleared through CME ClearPort ("Products").

Eligible Participants

There is no limit to the number of participants that may participate in the Program. Participants may be NYMEX members or non-members.

Program Term

Start date is November 12, 2018. End date is June 30, 2019.

Hours

8AM CST - 2PM CST.

Obligations

Participants in the Program must quote continuous two-sided markets in the Products at designated bid/ask spreads and quote sizes during a specified percentage of time-in-market.

Incentives

Upon meeting all Program obligations, as determined by the Exchange, participants will be eligible to receive predetermined incentives.

Monitoring and Termination of Status

The Exchange shall monitor trading activity and participants' performance and shall retain the right to revoke participant status if it concludes from review that a participant has failed to meet the obligations of the Program.
