New York Mercantile Exchange, Inc. ("NYMEX" or "Exchange") hereby notifies the Commodity Futures Trading Commission ("CFTC" or "Commission") that it plans to modify its incentive program in support of certain Natural Gas Options products ("Program"). The modifications to the Program will become effective on January 1, 2018.

Exhibit 1 sets forth the terms of this Program. Modifications appear below, with additions <u>underscored</u> and deletions overstruck.

NYMEX reviewed the designated contract market core principles ("Core Principles") as set forth in the Commodity Exchange Act ("CEA"). During the review, NYMEX staff identified the following Core Principles as potentially being impacted: Monitoring of Trading, Execution of Transactions, Protection of Market Participants, Compliance with Rules, and Recordkeeping.

The Program and proposed modifications will not impact the Exchange's ability to perform its trade practice and market surveillance obligations under the CEA. The Exchange's market regulation staff will monitor trading in the Program's products to prevent manipulative trading and market abuse. Additionally, NYMEX has implemented systems to track Program participants' volume to ensure proper distribution of earned incentives. The products included in this Program are listed for trading in the open and competitive market. The incentives available under the Program will apply to transactions by participants via any of NYMEX's execution and/or clearing venues, including our central limit order book. Therefore, the incentives under this Program protect any price discovery taking place in the centralized market. All market participants that register with NYMEX may participate in the Program. Chapter 4 of the NYMEX rules includes prohibitions against fraudulent, non-competitive, unfair or abusive practices. All participants must submit an application to NYMEX in which each participant will expressly agree to comply with and be subject to, applicable regulations and NYMEX rules. The Program is subject to the Exchange's record retention policies which comply with the CEA.

The Exchange certifies that the Program complies with the CEA and the regulations thereunder. There were no substantive opposing views to this Program.

EXHIBIT 1

NYMEX Natural Gas Options Gateway Incentive Program

Program Purpose

The purpose of the Program is to incentivize higher levels of volume contribution in NYMEX energy options products, specifically in natural gas options products across NYMEX's trading and clearing venues. Higher levels of volume and liquidity in the products listed below benefits all participants in the marketplace.

Product Scope

All NYMEX Natural Gas options products that are traded on the Globex Platform or cleared through the CME clearing house ("Products").

Eligible Participants

There is no limit to the amount of participants that may register for the Program. Participants may be a NYMEX member or non-member. Applicants for the Program that have previously been or currently are enrolled in the NYMEX Natural Gas Options Incentive Program may not participate. Applicants without previous enrollment in the NYMEX Crude and Refined Options Incentive Program but, at the time of application to the Program, would otherwise qualify for incentives under the NYMEX Natural Gas Options Incentive Program may not participate.

Program Term

Start date is March 12, 2013. End date is December 31, 2017 January 31, 2019.

Incentives

If a participant meets certain average monthly volume levels in the Products as determined by the Exchange, the respective participant may qualify to receive predetermined reduced transaction fee rates incentives in the Products.

Monitoring and Termination of Status

The Exchange shall monitor participants' activity in the Products and retains the right to revoke Program participant status if it concludes from review that a Program participant no longer meets the eligibility requirements of the Program.
