Dear Mr. Kirkpatrick:

New York Mercantile Exchange, Inc. ("NYMEX" or "Exchange") hereby notifies the Commodity Futures Trading Commission ("CFTC" or "Commission") that it plans to implement the NYMEX European Union Allowance (EUA) Market Maker Program ("Program"). The Program will become effective on August 1, 2024.

Exhibit 1 sets forth the terms of this Program.

The Exchange reviewed the designated contract market Core Principles as set forth in the Commodity Exchange Act ("CEA"). During the review, NYMEX staff identified the following Core Principles as potentially being impacted: Monitoring of Trading, Execution of Transactions, Protection of Market Participants, Compliance with Rules, Availability of General Information, and Recordkeeping.

The Program will not impact the Exchange's ability to perform its trade practice and market surveillance obligations under the CEA. The Exchange's market regulation staff will monitor trading in the Program's products to prevent manipulative trading and market abuse. Additionally, NYMEX has implemented systems to track Program participants' volume to ensure proper distribution of earned incentives. The products included in this Program are listed for trading in the open and competitive market. Participants in the Program are selected by Exchange staff using criteria as further stated in Exhibit 1. Chapter 4 of the NYMEX rules includes prohibitions against fraudulent, non-competitive, unfair or abusive practices. All participants must expressly agree to comply with and be subject to, applicable regulations and NYMEX rules. The Program is subject to the Exchange's record retention policies which comply with the CEA.

The Exchange certifies that the Program complies with the CEA and the regulations thereunder. There were no substantive opposing views to this Program.

EXHIBIT 1

NYMEX European Union Allowance (EUA) Market Maker Program

Program Purpose

The purpose of this Program is to build liquidity in the product listed below. The resulting increase in central limit order book liquidity benefits all participant segments in the market.

Product Scope

European Union Allowance (EUA) Futures ("ECF") that are traded on the CME Globex Platform or submitted for clearing through CME ClearPort ("Product").

Eligible Participants

There is no limit to the number of participants that may enroll in the Program. Participants may be NYMEX members or non-members.

Program Term

Start date is August 1, 2024. End date is January 31, 2025.

Hours

8:30AM - 4:30PM UK Time.

Obligations

In order to be eligible to receive the incentives, participants must meet certain volume thresholds or quote two-sided markets in the Product at predetermined average bid/ask spreads and minimum quote sizes during a certain percentage of time-in-market.

Incentives

Upon meeting the obligations, as determined by the Exchange, participants will receive predetermined incentives.

Monitoring and Termination of Status

The Exchange shall monitor participants' activity in the Product and retains the right to revoke participant status if it concludes from review that a participant no longer meets the requirements of the Program.
