Dear Sir or Madam,

Pursuant to Section 5c(c) of the Commodity Exchange Act and Section 40.6 of the regulations of the Commodity Futures Trading Commission, KalshiEX LLC (Kalshi) hereby notifies the Commission that it is amending the "Will the spot price of Bitcoin be <above/below> <price> by <date> at <time>?" contract (Contract). These changes will take effect 10 business days after certification, November 27th.

This contract is a straight-forward modification to the previous "Will the spot price of Bitcoin be <above/below> <price> by <date> at <time>?" contract. The changes are as follows:

- 1. The Underlying has been modified to include only the 60 seconds of prices prior to <date> at <time>, rather than an hour.
- 2. <time> has been modified to also include more time periods.
- 3. The Position Limit per market was increased to \$1,000,000 from \$25,000.

Along with this letter, Kalshi submitted the following documents:

- A clean copy of the amended Contract; and
- A redline showing the changes to Appendix A, the product rules and terms and conditions of the contract.

CONCISE EXPLANATION AND ANALYSIS OF THE PRODUCT AND ITS COMPLIANCE WITH APPLICABLE PROVISIONS OF THE ACT, INCLUDING CORE PRINCIPLES AND THE COMMISSION'S REGULATIONS THEREUNDER

Pursuant to Commission Rule 40.2(a)(3)(v), the following is a concise explanation and analysis of the product and its compliance with the Act, including the relevant Core Principles, and the Commission's regulations thereunder.

I. Introduction

The "Will the spot price of Bitcoin be <above/below> <price> by <date> at <time>?" Contract is a contract relating to the price of Bitcoin, a major digital asset. After careful analysis, Kalshi (hereafter referred to as "Exchange") has determined that the Contract complies with its vetting framework.

Kalshi has also determined that its Contract complies with staff advisory 18-14 regarding contracts whose underlying are digital asset products. It will be able to access data from the underlying spot markets that make up the cash-settlement prices, including information relating to the identity of the trader, prices, volumes, times, and quotes from the relevant market makers or traders.

Further information about the Contract, including an analysis of its risk mitigation and price basing utility, as well as additional considerations related to the Contract, is included in Confidential Appendices B, C, and D.

Pursuant to Section 5c(c) of the Act and CFTC Regulations 40.2(a), the Exchange hereby certifies that the listing of the Contract complies with the Act and Commission regulations under the Act.

General Contract Terms and Conditions: The Contract operates similar to other event contracts that the Exchange lists for trading. The minimum price fluctuation is \$0.01 (one cent). Price bands will apply so that Contracts may only be listed at values of at least \$0.01 and at most \$0.99. Further, the Contract is sized with a one-dollar notional value and has a minimum price fluctuation of \$0.01 to enable Members to match the size of the

contracts purchased to their economic risks. The Exchange has further imposed position limits (defined as maximum loss exposure) of \$25,000 USD on the Contract. As outlined in Rule 5.12 of the Rulebook, trading shall be available at all times outside of any maintenance windows, which will be announced in advance by the Exchange. Members will be charged fees in accordance with Rule 3.6 of the Rulebook. Fees are charged in such amounts as may be revised from time to time to be reflected on the Exchange's Website. A new Source Agency can be added via a Part 40 amendment. All instructions on how to access the Underlying are non-binding and are provided for convenience only and are not part of the binding Terms and Conditions of the Contract. They may be clarified at any time. Furthermore, the Contract's payout structure is characterized by the payment of an absolute amount to the holder of one side of the option and no payment to the counterparty. During the time that trading on the Contract is open, Members are able to adjust their positions and trade freely. After trading on the Contract has closed, the Expiration Value and Market Outcome are determined. The market is then settled by the Exchange, and the long position holders and short position holders are paid according to the Market Outcome. In this case, "long position holders" refers to Members who purchased the "Yes" side of the Contract and "short position holders" refers to Members who purchased the "No" side of the Contract. If the Market Outcome is "Yes," meaning that the CF Bitcoin Real Time Index is <above/below> price by <date> at <time>, then the long position holders are paid an absolute amount proportional to the size of their position and the short position holders receive no payment. If the Market Outcome is "No," then the short position holders are paid an absolute amount proportional to the size of their position and the long position holders receive no payment. Specification of the circumstances that would trigger a Market Outcome of "Yes" are included below in the section titled "Payout Criterion" in Appendix A.

APPENDIX A – CONTRACT TERMS AND CONDITIONS

Official Product Name: Will the spot price of Bitcoin be <above/below> <price> by <date> at <time>?

Rulebook: BTCMINMAX

BTCMINMAX

Scope: These rules shall apply to this contract.

Underlying: The Underlying for this Contract is the spot price of Bitcoin in U.S. dollars according to the CF Bitcoin Real-Time Index ("BRTI") between Issuance and <date>. This will be measured by taking a simple average of the BRTI values for any minute after Issuance and prior to <time> on <date>, ignoring the top 20% and the bottom 20% of values. Revisions to the Underlying made after Expiration will not be accounted for in determining the Expiration Value.

Source Agency: The Source Agency is CF Benchmarks.

Type: The type of Contract is an Event Contract.

Issuance: The Contract is based on the outcome of a recurrent data release, which is issued on a real-time basis. Thus, Contract iterations will be issued on a recurring basis, and future Contract iterations will generally correspond to the next day and year.

<price>: Kalshi may list iterations of the Contract with <price> levels that fall within an inclusive range between 0 and 100,000,000 at consecutive increments of <0.01>. Due to the potential for variability in the Underlying, the Exchange may modify <price> levels in response to suggestions by Members.

<date>: <date> refers to a calendar date specified by Kalshi. Kalshi may list iterations of the Contract corresponding to different statistical periods of <date>.

<time>: <time> refers to a time on a calendar date specified by Kalshi. Kalshi may list iterations of the Contract corresponding to different statistical periods of <time>.

Payout Criterion: The Payout Criterion for the Contract encompasses the Expiration Values that the index is <above/below> cprice> by <ate> at <time>. If no data is available on the Expiration Date at the Expiration Time, then the market resolves to No.

Minimum Tick: The Minimum Tick size for the referred Contract shall be \$0.01.

Position Limit: The Position Limit for the \$1 referred Contract shall be \$1,000,000 per strike, per Member.

Last Trading Date: The Last Trading Date of the Contract will be the sooner of the first 10:00 AM ET following the occurrence of an event encompassed by the Payout Criterion (whereupon

the Last Trading Time will be 10:00 AM ET) or <date> (whereupon the Last Trading Time will be <time>).

Settlement Date: The Settlement Date of the Contract shall be no later than the day after the Expiration Date, unless the Market Outcome is under review pursuant to Rule 7.1.

Expiration Date: The Expiration Date of the Contract shall be the sooner of the first 10:00 AM ET following the occurrence of an event encompassed by the Payout Criterion, <time> on <date>, the first 10:00 AM ET after <time> that data is available, or one month after <date>.

Expiration time: The Expiration time of the Contract shall be <time>.

Settlement Value: The Settlement Value for this Contract is \$1.00.

Expiration Value: The Expiration Value is the value of the Underlying as documented by the Source Agency on the Expiration Date at the Expiration time.

Contingencies: Before Settlement, Kalshi may, at its sole discretion, initiate the Market Outcome Review Process pursuant to Rule 6.3(c) of the Rulebook.
