RE: FOIA Confidential Treatment Request.

To Whom It May Concern:

Via electronic portal dated today, December 13, 2024, Chicago Mercantile Exchange Inc. (“CME Clearing”) submitted a supplemental organization rule certification filing (Submission No. 24-346S) to the Commodity Futures Trading Commission (“CFTC” or “Commission”) regarding amendments to CME, CBOT, NYMEX/COMEX Rule 802. (“Protection of Clearing House”), CME Rules 8F002. (“Definitions”) and 8F014. (“Mitigation of Losses”), and adoption of new definitions in CME, CBOT, NYMEX/COMEX Chapter iii (“Definitions”) and Rule 914. (“Base Clearing Member Default Obligations”), as well as associated amendments to the Base Default Management Guidelines (“Guidelines”) and CME’s Risk Management Framework (collectively, the “Rule Amendments”). The supplemental filing includes an Appendix A, Appendix B, and Appendix C (the “Confidential Information”) for which CME is submitting a detailed written justification setting forth grounds for this request for confidential treatment. The Confidential Information contains confidential and proprietary commercial information that could, if disclosed to the public, cause substantial harm to the competitive position of the submitter.

Pursuant to Sections 8 and 8(a) of the Commodity Exchange Act (“CEA”), as amended, and Commission Regulation 145.9(d), CME requests confidential treatment of the Confidential Information on the grounds that the Confidential Information contains confidential commercial information of the submitter (CME). Pursuant to Commission Regulation 145.9(d)(5), CME requests that confidential treatment be maintained for the Confidential Information until further notice from CME. We also request that the Commission notify the undersigned immediately after receiving any FOIA request for the Confidential Information or any other court order, subpoena or summons for same. Finally, we request that we be notified in the event the Commission intends to disclose the Confidential Information to Congress or to any other governmental agency or unit pursuant to Section 8 of the CEA. CME does not waive its notification rights under Section 8(f) of the CEA with respect to any subpoena or summons for the Confidential Information.
