## RE: Extension of the NYMEX Natural Gas Futures Volume Incentive Program NYMEX Submission No. 23-500

Dear Mr. Kirkpatrick:
New York Mercantile Exchange, Inc. ("NYMEX" or "Exchange") hereby notifies the Commodity Futures Trading Commission ("CFTC" or "Commission") of plans to extend the NYMEX Natural Gas Futures Volume Incentive Program ("Program") through January 31, 2025. The extension of the Program will become effective on February 1, 2024.

Exhibit 1 sets forth the terms of this Program. Modifications appear below, with additions underlined and deletions overstruck.

The Exchange reviewed the designated contract market Core Principles as set forth in the Commodity Exchange Act ("CEA"). During the review, NYMEX staff identified the following Core Principles as potentially being impacted: Monitoring of Trading, Execution of Transactions, Protection of Market Participants, Compliance with Rules, Availability of General Information, and Recordkeeping.

The Program does not impact the Exchange's ability to perform its trade practice and market surveillance obligations under the CEA. The Exchange's market regulation staff will monitor trading in the Program's products to prevent manipulative trading and market abuse. Additionally, NYMEX has implemented systems to track Program participants' volume to ensure proper distribution of earned incentives. The products included in this Program are listed for trading in the open and competitive market. Participants in the Program are selected by Exchange staff using criteria as further stated in Exhibit 1. Chapter 4 of the NYMEX rules includes prohibitions against fraudulent, non-competitive, unfair or abusive practices. All participants must expressly agree to comply with and be subject to, applicable regulations and NYMEX rules. The Program is subject to the Exchange's record retention policies which comply with the CEA.

The Exchange certifies that the Program complies with the CEA and the regulations thereunder. There were no substantive opposing views to this Program.

## EXHIBIT 1

## NYMEX Natural Gas Futures Volume Incentive Program

## Program Purpose

The purpose of this Program is to encourage large market participants to increase their Globex® volume enhancing market liquidity for the product listed below. A more liquid contract benefits all participants in the market.

## Product Scope

Henry Hub Natural Gas Futures ("NG") traded on Globex® ("Product").

## Eligible Participants

There is no limit to the number of participants in the Program. Participants must be NYMEX members. The Exchange, in its sole discretion, will use a variety of factors in determining whether a prospective participant is selected to participate in the Program, including the prospective participant's overall historical volume in the Product and the prospective participant's ability to maintain threshold volume obligations for the duration of the Program. The Exchange may from time to time add or subtract from the above factors as it deems necessary.

## Program Term

Start date is February 1, 2018. End date is January 31, 2024 January 31, 2025.

## Hours

## Obligations

In order to be eligible to receive the incentives, participants must meet predetermined volume thresholds in the Product.

## Incentives

Upon meeting all obligations, as determined by the Exchange, participants may be eligible to receive predetermined incentives.

## Monitoring and Termination of Status

The Exchange shall monitor participants' activity in the Product and retains the right to revoke participant status if it concludes from review that a participant no longer meets the eligibility criteria or obligations of the Program.
