Pursuant to Section 5c(c) of the Commodity Exchange Act and Section 40.2(a) of the regulations of the Commodity Futures Trading Commission, KalshiEX LLC (Kalshi), a registered DCM, hereby notifies the Commission that it is self-certifying the “What will be the most popular Wikipedia article in <year>?” contract (Contract). The Contract will initially be listed on **December 19, 2024**. The Exchange intends to list the contract on a **custom** basis. The Contract’s terms and conditions (Appendix A) includes the following strike conditions:

- <year> (the target year)
- <article> (the target article)
- <rank> (the target position of popularity)
- <category> (the target category of pages)
- <equal to/at least/above/below/between>

## **CONCISE EXPLANATION AND ANALYSIS OF THE PRODUCT AND ITS COMPLIANCE WITH APPLICABLE PROVISIONS OF THE ACT, INCLUDING CORE PRINCIPLES AND THE COMMISSION'S REGULATIONS THEREUNDER**

Pursuant to Commission Rule 40.2(a)(3)(v), the following is a concise explanation and analysis of the product and its compliance with the Act, including the relevant Core Principles (discussed in Appendix D), and the Commission's regulations thereunder.

### **I. Introduction**

The “What will be the most popular Wikipedia article in <year>?” Contract is a contract relating to Wikipedia.

Further information about the Contract, including an analysis of its risk mitigation and price basing utility, as well as additional considerations related to the Contract, is included in Confidential Appendices B, C, and D.

Pursuant to Section 5c(c) of the Act and CFTC Regulations 40.2(a), the Exchange hereby certifies that the listing of the Contract complies with the Act and Commission regulations under the Act.

**General Contract Terms and Conditions:** The Contract operates similar to other event contracts that the Exchange lists for trading. The minimum price fluctuation is \$0.01 (one cent). Price bands will apply so that Contracts may only be listed at values of at least \$0.01 and at most \$0.99. Further, the Contract is sized with a one-dollar notional value and has a minimum price fluctuation of \$0.01 to enable Members to match the size of the contracts purchased to their economic risks. As outlined in Rule 5.12 of the Rulebook, trading shall be available at all times outside of any maintenance windows, which will be announced in advance by the Exchange. Members will be charged fees in accordance with Rule 3.6 of the Rulebook. Fees, if they are charged, are charged in such amounts as may be revised from time to time to be reflected on the Exchange’s Website. A new Source Agency can be added via a Part 40 amendment. All instructions on how to access the Underlying are non-binding and are provided for convenience only and are not part of the binding Terms and Conditions of the Contract. They may be clarified at any time.

Furthermore, the Contract's payout structure is characterized by the payment of an absolute amount to the holder of one side of the option and no payment to the counterparty. During the time that trading on the Contract is open, Members are able to adjust their positions and trade freely. The Expiration Value and Market Outcome are determined at or after Market Close. The market is then settled by the Exchange, and the long position holders and short position holders are paid according to the Market Outcome. In this case, "long position holders" refers to Members who purchased the "Yes" side of the Contract and "short position holders" refers to Members who purchased the "No" side of the Contract. If the Market Outcome is "Yes," meaning that an event occurs that is encompassed within the Payout Criterion, then the long position holders are paid an absolute amount proportional to the size of their position and the short position holders receive no payment. If the Market Outcome is "No," then the short position holders are paid an absolute amount proportional to the size of their position and the long position holders receive no payment. Specification of the circumstances that would trigger a Market Outcome of "Yes" are included below in the section titled "Payout Criterion" in Appendix A.

**APPENDIX A – CONTRACT TERMS AND CONDITIONS**

**Official Product Name: “What will be the most popular Wikipedia article in <year>?”**  
**Rulebook: WIKIARTICLE**

## WIKIARTICLE

**Underlying:** The Underlying for this Contract is the number <rank> most popular (most page views) articles on English Wikipedia in <year>. Revisions to the Underlying made after Expiration will not be accounted for in determining the Expiration Value.

**Instructions:** The Underlying can be found at the website of the Wikimedia foundation. 2023's article can be found [here](#), for example. These instructions on how to access the Underlying are provided for convenience only and are not part of the binding Terms and Conditions of the Contract. They may be clarified at any time.

**Source Agency:** The Source Agency is the Wikimedia Foundation

**Type:** The type of Contract is an Event Contract.

**Issuance:** The Contract is based on the outcome of a recurrent data release, which is issued on a  basis. Thus, Contract iterations will be issued on a recurring basis, and future Contract iterations will generally correspond to the next year.

**<year>:** <year> refers to a calendar year specified by Kalshi. Kalshi may list iterations of the Contract corresponding to variations of <year>.

**<article>:** <article> refers to a specific Wikipedia article.

**<rank>:** <rank> refers to the ordinal ranking of the popularity of Wikipedia articles. In this context, “10” is lower than “9”.

**<category>:** <category> refers to a particular category of pages. Category may also take the form of no category, i.e. overall page rankings.

**Payout Criterion:** The Payout Criterion for the Contract encompasses the Expiration Values that <article> is <equal to/at least/above/below/between> <rank> in <category>. If the value of <equal to/at least/above/below/between> is “between”, then <rank> shall be a pair of values, and an Expiration Value that is greater than or equal to the lower value of the value pair and less than or equal to the greater value of the value pair are encompassed in the Payout Criterion.

**Minimum Tick:** The Minimum Tick size for the Contract shall be \$0.01.

**Position Accountability Level:** The Position Accountability Level for the Contract shall be

\$25,000 per strike, per Member.

**Last Trading Date:** The Last Trading Date of the Contract will be the same as the Expiration Date. The Last Trading Time will be the same as the Expiration time.

**Settlement Date:** The Settlement Date of the Contract shall be no later than the day after the Expiration Date, unless the Market Outcome is under review pursuant to Rule 7.1.

**Expiration Date:** The latest Expiration Date of the Contract shall be six months after the last day in <year>. If an event encompassed by the Payout Criterion occurs, or the data is released, expiration will be moved to an earlier date and time in accordance with Rule 7.2.

**Expiration time:** The Expiration time of the Contract shall be 10:00 AM ET.

**Settlement Value:** The Settlement Value for this Contract is \$1.00.

**Expiration Value:** The Expiration Value is the value of the Underlying as documented by the Source Agency on the Expiration Date at the Expiration time.

**Contingencies:** Before Settlement, Kalshi may, at its sole discretion, initiate the Market Outcome Review Process pursuant to Rule 6.3(d) of the Rulebook. If an Expiration Value cannot be determined on the Expiration Date, Kalshi has the right to determine payouts pursuant to Rule 6.3(b) in the Rulebook.
