	In 2020, the Climate-Related Market Risk Subcommittee released a report "Managing Climate Risk in the U.S. Financial System" presenting fifty-three recommendations to mitigate the risks to financial markets posed by the increasing frequency and severity of climate events. In June of last year, the Commission hosted a convening on voluntary carbon markets and solicited public comment on potential questions related to climate risk. This roundtable will explore the integrity, accountability, and quality of carbon offsets and related derivatives; role of registries; fraud enforcement actions and calls for a working group to study these issues.
