ISSUANCE OF COMPLAINT - CEA DOCKET NO. 83

(Administrative Hearing under the Commodity Exchange Act)

A complaint and notice of hearing has been signed by the Assistant Secretary of Agriculture, charging violation of the Commodity Exchange Act by:

Feldstein Produce Company,

Fulton Products Corporation,

Albert Feldstein,

Meyer Getz or Michael Getz,

Araness Corporation,

Becker Brokerage Company, and

Woodstock, Inc.

(All of Chicago, Illinois)

The complaint charges that respondent Albert Feldstein, general manager of Feldstein Produce Company and Fulton Products Corporation, wholesale egg and poultry firms, failed to file required reports on egg futures transactions on the Chicago Mercantile Exchange, filed false reports, and exceeded speculative trading and position limits. The complaint also charges that Fulton Products Corporation and its vice president, Meyer Getz, filed false reports, and that futures commission merchants Araness Corporation, Becker Brokerage Company and Woodstock, Inc. in carrying transactions for respondent Feldstein failed to record the true parties to such trades and keep required books and records; and that the two latter respondents filed false reports.

The issuance of a complaint under the Commodity Exchange Act does not constitute proof of violation of the law. Such violation is established only when the Judicial Officer of the Department has made a determination that the evidence substantiates allegations in the complaint. Complaints are filed in the Office of the Hearing Clerk of the Department of Agriculture and are a matter of public record. Pending disposition by the Judicial Officer, it is the policy of the Commodity Exchange Authority not to comment or elaborate on charges contained in complaints or to discuss evidence on which they are based.

A public hearing on the complaint is scheduled to be held before a referee at 10:00 a.m., local time, July 15, 1958, in Room 1200, Board of Trade Building, 141 West Jackson Boulevard, Chicago, Illinois.
