Rule Certification. New York Mercantile Exchange, Inc. Submission #09-320: Notification of Delisting of Contract Months for Three (3) Northwest Europe Gasoline Contracts Listed on CME ClearPort® and NYMEX Trading Floor

Dear Mr. Stawick:

The New York Mercantile Exchange, Inc. ("NYMEX" or "Exchange") is notifying the Commodity Futures Trading Commission ("CFTC" or "Commission") that it is self-certifying the delisting of back contract months for three Northwest Europe gasoline contracts such that the last listed contract month for the products reflected below is the March 2010 contract month. This self-certification shall be effective beginning trade date December 24, 2009. These contracts are currently listed on CME ClearPort and the NYMEX trading floor. The Exchange intends to delist these contracts in their entirety once open interest unwinds. A separate submission will be filed upon occurrence of that event.

Please note that in the Northwest (NWE) Europe market, these contracts are no longer assessed and are being replaced by the Euro-bob grade of gasoline. The Exchange currently offers similar products based on the Euro-bob grade of gasoline.
